

Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPI) TESTING AND COMPLIANCE

WHAT IS NPI TESTING?

Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPIs) are those activities or behaviors that reduce risk of workplace transmission of COVID-19, such as surveillance testing for COVID-19, masking, distancing, hand hygiene and workplace structural modifications.

Effective October 1, 2021, California Department of Public Health (CDPH) is requiring that all Faculty, Employees and Students meet COVID-19 testing requirements if they are to work on-site:

- Fully Vaccinated* or else a CDPH-Approved Exemption with NPI Testing

WHO REQUIRES NPI TESTING?

- All unvaccinated/partially vaccinated staff are required to follow NPI Testing if they are working at any UCSF facilities, including those remote from hospital and clinics.
- To comply with University of California requirements, NPI Testing is required **until 2 weeks** after your final vaccine dose. This differs from CDPH health order which ends NPI testing **on the day of** the final vaccine dose.

WHO ARE EXEMPTED FROM NPI TESTING?

- Approved 100% Remote Staff and Students, or
- < 90 days since COVID-19 infection

STEPS INVOLVED IN NPI TESTING

1. **Enrollment** - Because we do not know everyone's schedule, you are initially enrolled in UCSF's Color testing program with twice weekly testing through the Color registry and reminder system. Please contact atp@ucsf.edu if you belong in a different testing frequency category (see below). If you are unable to use Color testing for some or all tests required for your testing category, you may use non-UCSF testing sources (see below).
2. **Pick up Test Kit** - Test kits can be picked up a variety of sites including Mission Bay, Parnassus, Mt Zion, and Laurel Heights campuses, as well as ZSFG and BCH Oakland. You may pick-up a 1-month supply of test kits as needed. [Click here for testing locations](#)
3. ****Notification from Color** - You will receive a notice directly from Color to complete your first Color test. If you do not receive this notification, please contact atp@ucsf.edu. After completing the first test, you will be sent automatic reminders when your next test needs to be completed.
 - If you are not on-site at least one day per week (i.e., ad hoc testing), non-UCSF testing is permitted with conditions (See acceptable COVID Test table below)

ACCEPTABLE COVID TEST TYPES

***Fully vaccinated** is defined as > 2 weeks since 2nd dose of a 2-dose vaccine, or > 2 weeks since 1st dose of a 1-dose vaccine

****NEW TO COLOR?** You can drop-in or schedule a visit with an Asymptomatic Testing Center at Mission Bay, Parnassus, or Mt Zion. Someone at the site will assist you to register a Color account and activate a test kit through your phone or a tablet/computer. They can also show you how to do a self-swab collection.
